

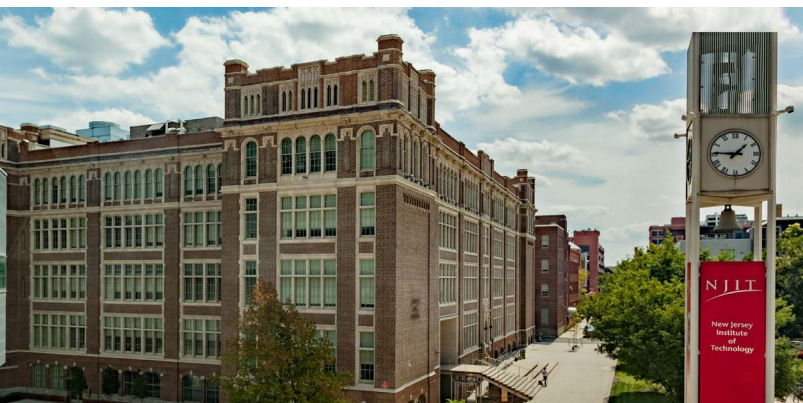

Undergraduate Admission Criteria

- Completed application form
- \$75 nonrefundable application fee
- GPA of 3.3/4.0 (First Class Standing for British System)
- IELTS 6.0; TOEFL 79 internet-based examination
- SAT test scores of 1270+ (only required if applying for NJIT's merit-based scholarship ranging from \$10,000 to \$25,000)
- Recommendation letter (preferred)
- Personal statement
- Architecture, Digital Design, Industrial and Interior Design require a portfolio
- Students who choose to waive the SAT are eligible for \$10,000 scholarship

Graduate Admission Criteria

- Completed application form
- \$75 nonrefundable application fee (waived for certain regions)
- GPA of 3.0/4.0 (First Class Standing for British System)
- IELTS 6.5; TOEFL IBT 79
- GRE test scores (GMAT for Management and MBA programs)
- Recommendation letter (1 for M.S., 3 for Ph.D.)
- Personal statement (preferred)
- Architecture and Infrastructure Planning require a portfolio, supplemental application and two additional recommendation letters
- First year scholarship of \$2,000
