Supportive and personalised International student support

At SCU you are not just a number. To us, every student matters, and our free and personalised international student support services on-campus are there to give students the guidance they need to adjust positively to Australian university life.

All of our branch campuses have student welfare counsellors on hand, who meet with students and run free workshops on a diverse range of topics, from mindfulness to culture shock and managing exam stress.

Our careers counsellors run excellent workshops too, preparing students for the demands of the Australian workplace by offering workshops on resume writing, interview skills and employer networking, just to name a few!

SCU also has student experience officers, who run year-round social and cultural events as well as offering exciting excursions to famous local landmarks. These experiences are a great way for students to connect with their fellow peers and to meet other students from all around the world.

In terms of academic support, SCU students can opt to attend our free Academic Skills Workshops that are held on a regular basis on all campuses. Our learning advisers run different workshops throughout the year, from how to improve your academic writing and referencing skills, to the all-important exam preparation.

Flexible timetables mean more work/life balance

SCU offers a unique trimester study model at all three branch campuses in Sydney, Melbourne and Perth.

The 3 unit (first trimester) + 3 unit (second trimester) +2 unit (third trimester) academic year learning module gives students more flexibility with how they study and when.

Our trimester system allows students to balance work and study by spreading the study load across three trimesters. Students can also fast-track their studies, allowing them to complete their degree earlier.*

This non-traditional and specialised approach to learning means that students can combine online study with classroom contact hours in a way that suits them, with some students electing to be on campus for only 2 to 3 days per week.

*Students need to provide satisfactory academic results and submit the overloading application for approval.

Offering maximum credit transfers from International and Australian Universities

SCU supports students who want to transfer credits from a previous public or private provider into an SCU course.

We consider both onshore (Australian) and offshore (International) qualifications for Advanced Standing, which means you could end up completing your SCU course in a shorter time frame.

Undergraduate students can have a maximum of 16 credit units granted towards their qualification and postgraduate students can have a maximum of 8 credit units granted.

Simple academic entry requirements

At SCU we want to give every student the opportunity to gain a quality education, so we offer interviews to students who may not meet the academic entry requirements to enter directly into one of our courses.

The minimum academic pass rate to be considered for an interview is 25% for undergraduate students, and 30% for postgraduate students.

- If a student's pass rate is more than 50%, then SCU can accept the student directly.
- If a student's pass rate is in the range of 25% to 49%, then a Statement of Purpose (SOP) is required.

Simple admission entry requirements

- Many onshore students will not be required to submit GTE or financial evidence
- Onshore applicants who have provided a complete application and who do not require advanced standing can expect 24-hour turnaround times for a full offer
- Temporary Graduate Visa holders (Subclass 485), Tourist Visa holders (Subclass 600) or Working Holiday Visa holders (Subclass 417) are classified as onshore students for admission purposes
- Undergraduate students can apply to SCU's MBA course without previous work experience
- Diploma students can apply to a postgraduate SCU course if they have 5+ years of relevant work experience.

Flexible and affordable education

SCU offers a high-quality education at an affordable price, with attractive scholarships and low deposit options.

- **Ongoing scholarships:**
 - All SCU students can apply for the \$5000 'Nathan Asher Scholarship' if they have achieved an average academic score of 75% or over for the relevant session period.
 - We have a range of scholarships available that new students can apply for. Availability and eligibility of these can be discussed 1:1 between our agent partners and appropriate SCU relationship manager.

- **Low deposit options:**

- Onshore students can secure a COE by paying 50% of the first-trimester tuition fee. The remaining first-trimester balance should be paid at enrolment, but an extension may be granted for students if they are given special consideration.
